AUTAUGA COUNTY COMMISSION RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION 2022-08

WHEREAS, the Autauga County Commission has agreed to expend certain funds for the Central Alabama Community pursuant to a Joint Post-Secondary Education Campus Development Agreement; and

WHEREAS, part of the Autauga County Commission's obligation under the Campus

Development Agreement is a capital contribution in the amount of one million four hundred thousand dollars (\$1,400,000.00); and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Autauga County Commission to finance five hundred ninety-two thousand dollars (\$592,000.00) of this sum with a General Obligation Warrant over a period of ten (10) years to ensure liquidity, stability, and prevent depletion of reserve accounts; and

WHEREAS, Central Alabama Electric Cooperative has agreed to loan said funds to the Autauga County Commission for a term of ten (10) years; and

WHEREAS, First Community Bank of Central Alabama has agreed to loan said funds at an interest rate of the prime rate as published in the Wall Street Journal on the date of the loan closing minus 1%: and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Autauga County Commission authorizes the Chairman and Treasurer/Administrator to execute and deliver an agreement with Central Alabama Electric Cooperative to establish a loan on the terms as set out above in the amount of five hundred ninety-two thousand dollars (\$592,000.00).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any and all necessary representatives of the Autauga

County Commission are authorized and directed to execute and deliver, or attest a signature required on, any document reasonably necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Autauga County Commission hereby intends that pursuant to Section 265(b) of the Internal Revenue Code, as amended, this debt shall be a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code
