These projects include the Tenaska plant locating in Autauga County, the Robert Trent Golf Trail locating in Prattville, the construction of the Autauga Metro Jail, the construction of the Probate Office, and other meaningful projects which continue to enrich the lives of Autauga County citizens; and

WHEREAS, Section 14-6-42 of the Code of Alabama (1975) states that the feeding of prisoners shall be from funds paid for by the State in the amount of two dollars and twenty-five and no/100's (\$2.25) dollars per day for each prisoner and from an account designated the Prisoner Feeding Fund pursuant to Section 14-6-47 of the Code of Alabama (1975);

WHEREAS, the Prisoner Feeding Fund pursuant to Section 14-6-47 of the Code of Alabama (1975), is depleted and, pursuant to Section 14-6-51 of the Code of Alabama (1975), the County Commission in conjunction with the Sheriff seeks to apply for funding from the State from the **Emergency Prisoner Feeding Fund; and**

WHEREAS it is required by the U.S. Department of Transportation in accord with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under 49 USC Section 5311 the applicant gives an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and other pertinent directives and the U.S. Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the Applicant that disadvantaged business enterprises (minority business enterprises and woman business enterprises) be utilized to the fullest extent possible in connection with this/these project(s), and that definite procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that disadvantaged business enterprises (DBEs) shall have the maximum feasible opportunity to compete for contracts and purchase orders when procuring construction contracts, supplies, equipment contracts, or consultant and other services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY Autauga County Commission

- That Autauga County Commission is authorized to execute and file (an) application(s) on behalf of Autauga County Rural Transportation with the Alabama Department of Transportation to aid in the financing of administration, planning, capital and/or operating assistance projects pursuant to 49 USC Section 5311, the Alabama Public Transportation Grant Program, and the Alabama Elderly and Disabled Transit Fare Assistance Program.
- 2. That Autauga County Commission is authorized to execute and file with such applications an assurance, or any other document required by the U.S. Department of Transportation and the Alabama Department of Transportation effectuating the purpose of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
- That Autauga County Commission is authorized to furnish such additional information as the U.S. Department of Transportation and the Alabama Department of Transportation may require in connection with the application for the Program of Projects submitted to FTA.
- That Autauga County Commission is authorized to set forth and execute affirmative disadvantaged business enterprise
 policies in connection with any procurements made as part of the project.
- That Autauga County Commission is authorized to execute grant agreements on behalf of Autauga County Rural Transportation with the Alabama Department of Transportation for aid in the financing of the administration, planning, capital, and/or operating assistance projects.
